Welcome to the second newsletter of January!

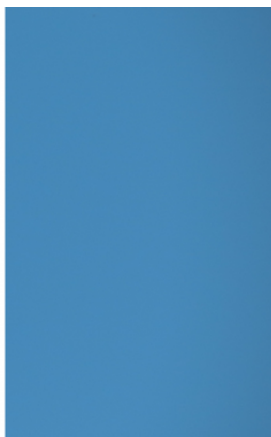
