After the Prague European Summit, our researchers and analysts got back to work and commented in the media on the events after the European elections, the negotiations of the individual parties elected to the European Parliament and commented on its future priorities.

On June 15 we attended **the Open Day at the Ministry of Foreign Affairs** in the gardens of the Czernin Palace. We presented our institute and our projects. And for the children we prepared a European-themed games.

This week we published the eighteenth episode of **the Café Evropa podcast**. This time, the host Jolana Humpálová talked to the guests about **volunteering**. In the episode you will learn more not only about volunteering with **Junák - Czech Scouts**, but also how to volunteer abroad, for example with the **European Solidarity Corps**. On Saturday, June 15, we participated in the Open Day at the Ministry of Foreign Affairs, where we presented our Institute and our projects. We also prepared games for children with a European theme. The gardens of the Czernin Palace were filled with stands with representatives of the MFA, discussions on foreign issues, screenings, exhibitions, live music and quizes.



On Wednesday, June 26, another of the Café Evropa regional debates took place in the City of Mělník. Guests and visitors evaluated not only the Czech Republic's 20 years in the EU, but also talked about the Migration Pact and the Green Deal, as well as how European subsidies have helped the development of the town.

The invitation to the Municipal Library was accepted by the Mayor of Mělník, Tomáš Martinec, and Barbora Pištorová, editor of Euractiv.cz. The debate, organised in cooperation with the Representation of the European Commission in the Czech Republic, was moderated by Viktor Daněk, Deputy Director of EUROPEUM Institute.
