Podcast: will traditional media survive the 21st century? | Opinion on the National Convention - The Union and its defences

In the second half of November, our experts commented extensively on the **events surrounding the approval of the European Commission.** They also dealt directly with the individual Commissioners - which of them will have the biggest influence on the future direction of the European Union.

We also celebrated 35 years of democracy on Národní třída. We recorded a public hosting of Café Evropa podcast about the state of the media in the 21st century. Guests Johana Bázlerová, author of the Instagram profile Jsem v obraze, Jiří Kubík, former editor-in-chief of Seznam Zprávy and Andrea Procházková, former deputy editor-in-chief of Respekt, debated what problems the media are facing in the current digital age and how the young generation is shaping the media market.

With the Café Evropa series of regional debates we visited Starý Plzenec, Žďár nad Sázavou and Česká Třebová. Our guests and participants debated not only about the current challenges of the European Union, but also what 20 years of the Czech Republic in the EU means for their town.

We have also published several papers by our researchers. In collaboration with other authors, EUROPEUM Institute Project Manager **Oszkár Roginer-Hofmeister** wrote about how **Ukraine is presented in the V4 mainstream media.** Researchers **Zuzana Krulichová and Danielle Piatkiewicz**, together with Institute Associate Research Fellow **Tereza Novotná**, drafted the **Declaration to the National Convention on the Union and its defence**. 

We finished the November series of debates in Česká Třebová. Filip Křenek, analyst at EUROPEUM Institute, František Novotný from the Department of European Policy Coordination of the Office of the Government of the Czech Republic and Kateřina Zichová, editor of Euractiv.cz, talked to the participants about the European elections, European regulation and economic development of the EU and the situation in Slovakia and Hungary.
