Last days to apply for the Think Visegrad Visiting Fellowship!

Eight visiting fellowships are available for Autumn or Winter of 2023. Each of the core network think tanks (see list below) will host one non-V4 expert fellow with at least five years' research experience. Each selected candidate will have the opportunity to take part in the institute's activities for a period of six to eight weeks (at least 4 weeks in-person). During this period, each fellow will be expected to develop a policy paper and deliver one public presentation on a pre-agreed topic. A lump sum of €3,000 will be given to each selected visiting fellow to cover all necessary costs and expenditures related to his or her stay at the hosting institute (e.g. lodging and local transport). Think Visegrad will also cover the cost of international travel to the hosting institute for the visiting fellow up to the amount of €500.

# **GLOBSEC 2023 Bratislava Forum**



GLOBSEC's 2023 Bratislava Forum, the international preeminent strategic conference on the frontlines of a newly divided world, took place from May 29 - 31. The discussions were guided by three overarching themes: continuing support for Ukraine, resilience of Europe in the face of mitigating global consequences of the conflict in a global dialogue. The GLOBSEC's guests of honour have included Ursula von der Leyen, Emmanuel Macron, Zuzana Čaputová, Věra Jourová and countless other influential stakeholders.

The annual flagship conference of the IIR, co-organized with the Czech Ministry of Foreign Affairs, took place on May 15-16. The conference Multilateral Czechia reflected on Czech priorities in relation to European and global events. As a keynote speaker, we had the pleasure to welcome Nathalie Tocci who addressed the issue of internal coherence of the EU amidst the Russian aggression against Ukraine. Further, our high-level panel formed by Minna Ålander, Justyna Gotkowska, Mats Braun, and Jaroslav Kurfürst and moderated Barbora Chaloupková focused on a debate of whether the "East" will become the new center of gravity in Europe.

# What is the 'Think Visegrad in Brussels' project?

In the first half of 2016, the Think Visegrad platform members agreed on the idea proposed by the EUROPEUM Institute for European Policy, to create a common representation office in Brussels. The main motivation for it is the need to encourage debate on issues of common interest to the EU and the V4 and explain the positions of the V4 to a wide audience. We would like to project an image of constructive partners, to explain the dynamics of the debates within our regions and to highlight our active contributions to EU policy-making. With this view and with the aim to boost discussions specifically on the Czech Republic and the EU, EUROPEUM has opened its Brussels office in January 2016.

The pilot project run in the second half of 2016 and consisted of many interesting and successful events. The second part of the project was approved in June 2017 and continued until the end of the year. Project has been continuously running since 2018.
